Advocacy

- OACC builds relationships with government officials and attends government events to foster support for the private career college sector
- OACC meets with senior officials from the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities every six to seven weeks to raise emerging issues of concern and provide feedback from the sector
- OACC submits recommendations to the government on policy that impacts the career college sector and its students
- OACC advocates on behalf of individual members where appropriate
- Members can have their say by volunteering on OACC committees

Services

- Joining OACC gives private career colleges access to services from both the Ontario and the National Associations of Career Colleges
- OACC provides a student transcript storage service for private career colleges and their students
- OACC operates a Financial Aid Office for processing OSAP applications on behalf of its members and their students
- OACC sponsors information and emergency meetings for the sector as needed
- OACC communicates regularly with members to keep them up to date on matters that may impact their businesses
- OACC organizes an annual provincial conference to provide opportunities for private career colleges to network, attend information sessions, and participate in professional development
